Bassist Chris Riggenbach has been a professional musician for over 20 years. During that time, he has performed with musicians such as Gary Motley, Wycliffe Gordon, Victor Goines, Audrey Shakir, Whitney Marchelle, Ted Howe, Marcus Lewis, Josh Lawrence, The Macon Pops Orchestra featuring Matt Catingub and Steve Moretti, Dwight Andrews, Kayla Taylor, Jose Manuel Garcia, Bob Bakert, Larry Camp, Dan Baraszu, Mike Kelly, Tempest Little Big Band, The 4th Ward Afro-Klezmer Orchestra, Jazz Legacy Big Band, and Gold Sparkle Band. Saxophonist Mike Dopazo is also featured on the recording.

Chris has also performed internationally at different cities across the U.S. and Europe. In 2010, he performed in Poland with The Josh Lawrence Jazz 3 featuring trumpeter Josh Lawrence and drummer Mike De Castro. The trio performed at The Sopot Molo Jazz Festival, Piwnica pod Baranami in Krakow, Dwor Artusa in Torun and other jazz festivals.
